## WELTEN GOLF RESORT

**In** the heart of the golf resort stands a historical park and castle, with its origin dated back to the 15th century. Surrounded by woods, it has served as the hunting residence of the aristocratic Apponyi family. In the 19th century it was re-build in classicistic style. In 1886 the castle and its surrounding grounds were bought by Rudolf Wiener Welten, who, in 1921, sold them to Dr. Gabriel Kuchta and his wife. After 1948's takeover of the ruling power by the communists, the castle and its grounds were socialized. The property was taken into state custody, causing irreparable damages. Since the 1950's the castle was put through several insensitive re-adjustments, that in an unfortunate way ignored the character of the building and its courtyard.

In the 1990's the castle was returned to the heirs of the original proprietors. After extensive reconstruction work it now serves as a hotel and restaurant.
